### Ideas for Home Learning

Try and take opportunities to talk to your child about colours. Do they have a favourite colour? Do you? Why is it your favourite colour? If your child doesn't know all their colours, play games to help them learn them eg 'I spy something coloured green' then repeat with other colours, treasure hunts to find objects of a different colour - you could give them a time limit to find to make it even more fun! Young children often learn well through song
